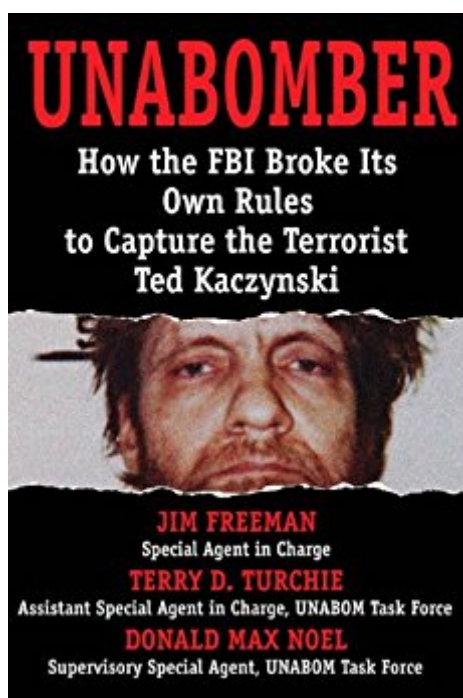

Synopsis

This is the story of how the FBI broke its own rules to catch the notorious Unabomber who had randomly killed and maimed people while leaving a cold trail of terrorism for sixteen years.. abomination. It's mostly detailed dialog that's presented as detailed conversations. This incredibly dumb and ill-advised adds nothing whatsoever to the story but does seriously detract from the reading experience. It's so awful that I must quote a paragraph from the book because you'd not believe me if I tried to describe how insipid this abomination of a book is.
