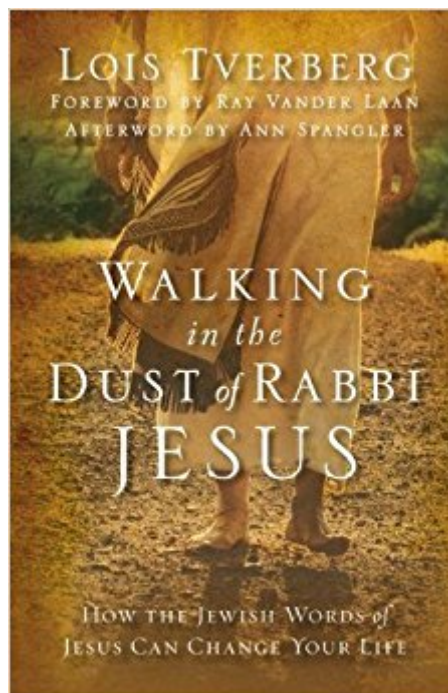




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Walking In The Dust Of Rabbi Jesus: How The Jewish Words Of Jesus Can Change Your Life

Lois Tverberg's *Walking in the Dust of Rabbi Jesus* is a fun and enlightening read. It brings many of Jesus' words and teachings to life as it explores the cultural, Jewish context of those teachings. The

author explains numerous Jewish idioms and expressions that expose deeper and richer--and often clearer--meanings to what Jesus said. She sheds new light on many of Jesus' familiar parables. I thought the earlier chapters were especially helpful, and was amazed at the book's voluminous endnotes, many of which are as fun and helpful to read as the body of the book. In short, I recommend *Walking in the Dust of Rabbi Jesus*. Whether you're a newbie to the subject or an experienced Bible student, you'll find much to learn and much to appreciate there.
