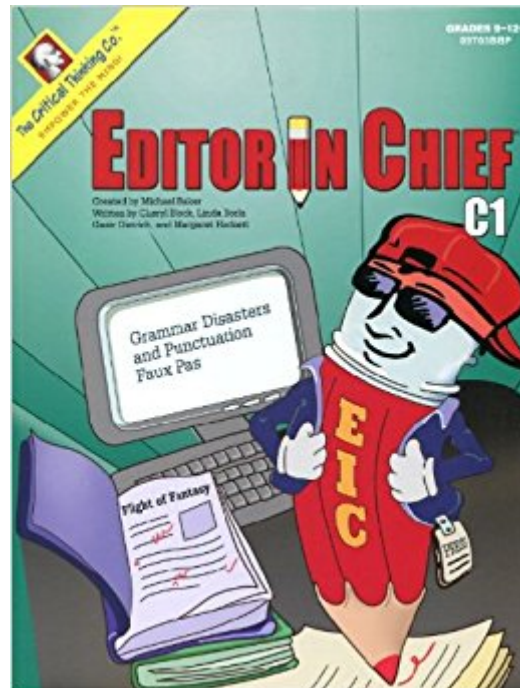

I chose this when homeschooling, because what the students are required to do is similar to what they do on achievement tests, ACT tests or CLEP tests. Basically, a scenario is presented followed by an article that was hypothetically written about that scenario. The students then pick out errors, whether grammatical, spelling, content or just misleading in the way it is written. The back of the book will tell you what kind of error it is (ending with preposition, run-on, etc.) Then the student can

re-write the article if you desire. Very good!

Upon receiving this book, I noted that lessons 1 through 22 had been torn from the book. Ultimately, this renders this book completely useless to me. I also noted that nearly all of the remaining pages in this book had large areas of pencil graffiti. I am sooo disappointed with this purchase. I have never been moved to write a review before, but felt the need to following this purchase.

This book is excellent for teaching good writing skills by having the students find grammar/content/punctuation mistakes in interesting articles. I am amazed at how well this works with my kids... Learning abounds!

They are short and the number of errors in a passage is noted in advance, so that students know when to stop or to keep searching.
