This product was instrumental in helping me pass the Series 65. After purchasing this product and using the complementary Pass the 65 book, I scored a 90 on my first attempt at the exam. Practice questions are critical when preparing for the Series 65. While questions from this bank will not be exact replicas of what you'll actually see on the real exam, they are a necessary tool to give you a feel for what to expect. I would like to point out that many of the free sample questions floating around online are not consistent with current financial industry regulations and may end up confusing people preparing to take the exam. I advise going with a reputable product such as this to ensure you are being quizzed on the most up-to-date information.

I passed the 65 yesterday with an 86 while using only this book and the practice exam bank. As others have mentioned the writing style makes the sometimes boring material much easier to get through. His definitions of options were the best I've seen (I took the 7 about 15 years ago)...referencing a guy walking into a bar and betting with patrons on the stock prices of Coke vs. Pepsi. This kind descriptive storytelling made the material much easier to retain. The lemonade stand analogy for income statement study was excellent, too. Chapter 4 became a bit of a grind...even Walker couldn't find much of anything humorous about the multitude of laws, regulations and rules around security and adviser registrations, but he did his best. The guy can be pretty funny. If you're taking the 65, buy this book and the associated exam bank...nothing else (including the go/no go exams) is necessary. Study it well and you'll do fine.

I used this as my main source to learn the material for the 65. I read through this book twice, took a couple practice tests, and got a 91% on my exam. The information covered almost everything that was on the test, and the book was readable. There are 4 sections, corresponding to the 4 areas of the exam. Organization of topics within those sections seemed a little loose at times. But the most glaring problem was that this book had clearly not gone through a final proofreading. There are spots where identical paragraphs are repeated and lines are cut off. There was one place where a graphic should have been that had [Insert graphic here] printed instead. And there are multiple examples of just the letter e used in the middle of a sentence--from the context, you could tell that apparently someone did a universal Find/Replace and replaced the word "every" with just "e." That being said, *most* of the book was okay, and I was able to get past the editing mistakes and learn what I needed to learn. If you can get over the fact that the poor editing makes this the book equivalent of a crime against nature, you'll be fine.

I ordered this book just to get some light reading done before taking the 65 exam, and before I decided which crash course I wanted to take. I started to read mixed chapters and realized how well written it was. This book runs you through the fundamentals of being in the securities industry, and how to apply knowledge and wisdom to your career. I ended up reading the entire book from cover to cover. Even if you are not taking the series 65, this book is essential to anyone's financial life. PLAIN ENGLISH. I took the exam and passed with 83%. I wasn't trying to ace it anyway, I took it easy on the exam, but I read this book from cover to cover. This is a masterpiece, put it up on your bookshelf for when you need fundamentals practice. A month later I ordered the series 7 books, and got the online crash course as well. I think it's worth it to go straight to examzone.com and just order the crash course bundle while you are at it. The examples and teaching style of Robert Walker is some of the best I have ever seen on the crash course. I just received this book after studying the Kapland book for 4.5 months. And getting a 69 on the test. Much easier read for me personally. Less words describing the information. Lots of the info on this test is strait memorization, but I believe with there description style I will excel in truly understanding the information to be able to easily pass the test when I take it again.

I got 71% for my first trial and felt very frustrated. I feel the real exam is much more detailed than what I learned from Investopedia free materials. So I bought Robert Walker's materials for the second trial. It's a great study material, very clear and comprehensive. I also bought Pass The 65 exams for more practice. It contains seven practice exams and eight quiz. The average score for my seven practice exams is 79% and I got 79% in real exam too.

I read the book and with about 80 + hours I passed the test. The Good: 1) Very easy to read. 2) Robert gives real life examples which makes things easy to understand. 3) The book covers about 95% of what came in the exam. Everybody's experience could be different as what test will be administered to a candidate can differ substantially. 4) The book is short and sweet not like other review books which could have over 700 pages. This book has just about 400 pages to read. The Bad: 1) It lacked questions which I could relate to in the exam - Not a big issue as the book helped me understand the concepts. 2) It had very few practice questions. I ended up taking free practice tests from the Investopedia website (There were about 420 questions in all). I did about 350 plus. Overall I have positive views about the book as it helped me pass the exam.

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
