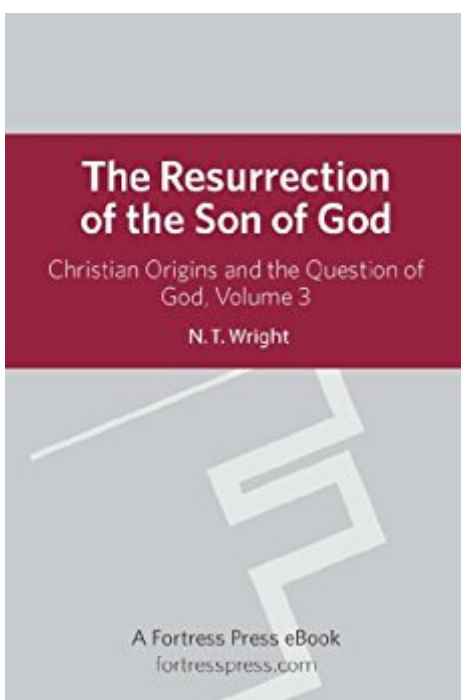


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Resurrection Son Of God V3: Christian Origins And The Question Of God



Synopsis

This book, third in Wright's series *Christian Origins and the Question of God*, sketches a map of ancient beliefs about life after death, in both the Greco-Roman and Jewish worlds. It then highlights the fact that the early Christians' belief about the afterlife belonged firmly on the Jewish spectrum, while introducing several new mutations and sharper definitions. This, together with other features of early Christianity, forces the historian to read the Easter narratives in the gospels, not simply as late rationalizations of early Christian spirituality, but as accounts of two actual events: the empty tomb of Jesus and his "appearances."

N.T. Wright is a rare combination of a brilliant scholar who can write so that non-scholars can understand. This book, like most of his, is nothing less than illuminating.

This really is something. The plan cannot be simpler: to demonstrate that the earliest Christians believed in resurrection - in the traditional Judaic sense, i.e. of the body, and they did not use the term resurrection to denote a merely Platonic notion of the immortality of the soul. That is simply not

what they referred to. Not only that, but they were the first people in history to believe that a single person, namely Jesus of Nazareth, resurrected well before everyone else does - and everyone will. This seems, according to many, to be a very plausible explanation to the sudden burgeoning of the Christian faith in the first century. Joining the dots together, one has to consider that the accounts of the resurrection of Jesus could very well be historically sound. At well over 700 pages, it is certainly both exhaustive and exhausting. It is indeed at times repetitive but overall is worth the while. Five stars.

Wright's book has exemplary scholarship and presents the bodily resurrection of Jesus as evidentially the belief of the early Church. To my mind he successfully shows that attempts to say that the bodily resurrection was read back into the stories at a later date are misguided at best and downright unscholarly at worst. Whether one believes in the resurrection or not, it is clear that the early Christians did.
