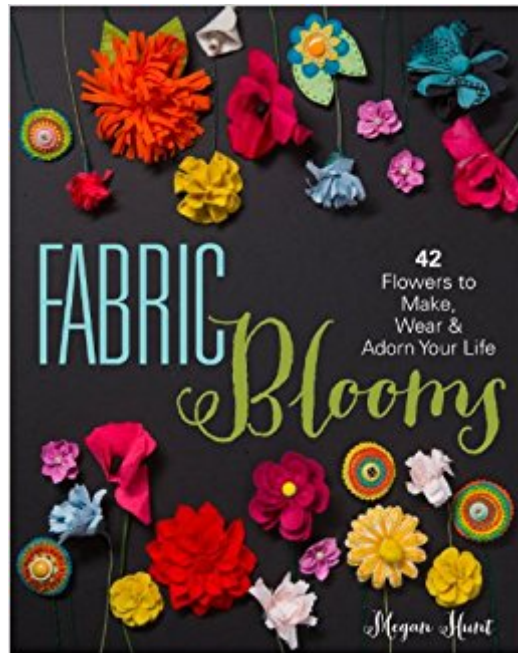




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Fabric Blooms: 42 Flowers To Make, Wear & Adorn Your Life

There are lots of different flowers to try and templates for cutting out petals and pieces are included. The projects are compact and portable as well, so you can take them anywhere. All you need are a

few basic supplies and your favorite and/or scrap fabrics. Seriously, this book is easy to use. Meghan Hunt and her editor(s) did a great job of keeping most of the instructions all on one page (no turning pages while trying to hold pieces together!) and using individual photographs that showed the different steps of flower building. Lots of different textures and fabrics are highlighted in the book. I've tried a couple flowers (with success!) and I expect to use this book for my primary flower resource. I already used a flower to dress up a birthday package and plan to make a couple for a gift for my mother.
