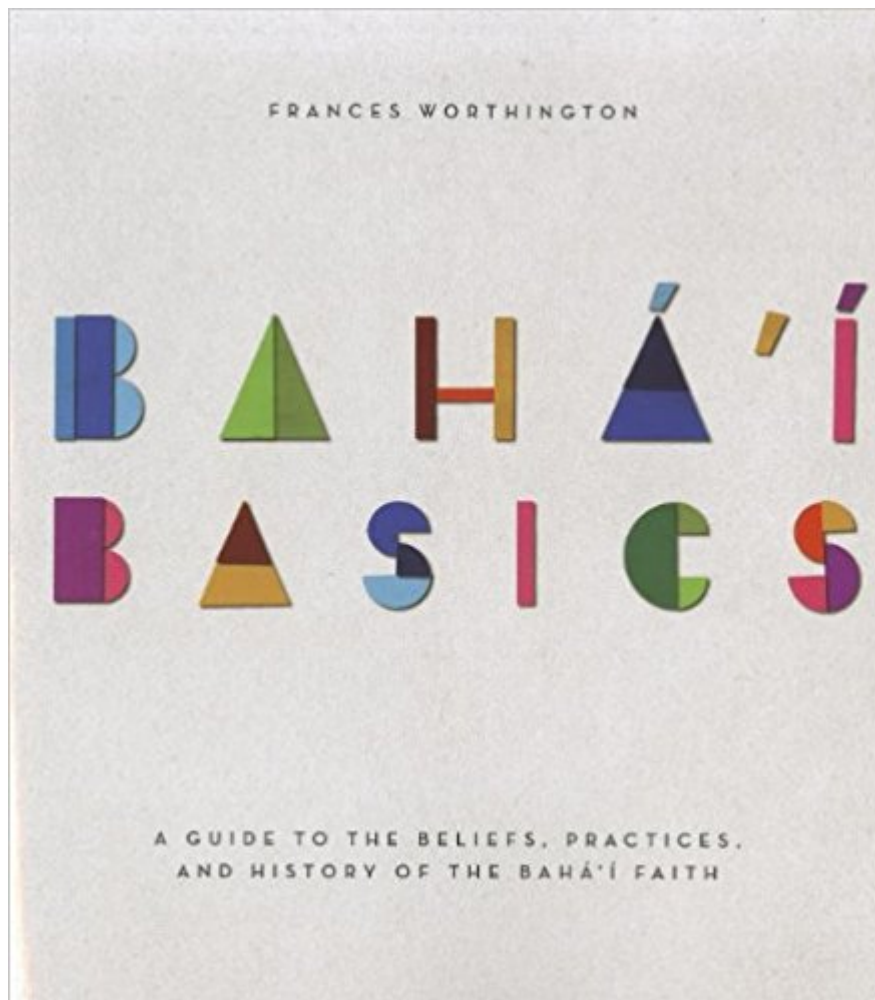

When I heard there was a new book with basic info on the Baha'i Faith, my first thought was how big is this book going to be...? I've been a Baha'i for more than 10 years, and there is so much to learn about it, I wondered how it was all going to fit into a regular-sized book. I was pleased to find that despite the brevity (the book is less than 200 pages even if you count the appendices and bibliography, and the typeface is nice and big) I could not find a single thing that the author left out that I felt was important enough to include. This is a great resource for people who don't have much time to read but who want to know enough of the practical details to be well-informed about the emerging phenomenon that is the Baha'i Faith. It's written in a question-and-answer style that makes it easy to skip around and focus on the topics you're most interested in. I think it will be very useful for teachers, social workers, politicians, neighbors, family members and friends of Baha'is, and people of any religion who are interested in the Interfaith movement. I have to admit I was surprised and disappointed to find a couple of typos in the book. This is the first Baha'i book I've read where I've come across that. Other than that, I think the author did a good job of presenting the basics of the Faith in an objective manner, and by including plenty of quotes from the Baha'i Writings in context of the Q&A framework, there is still plenty of 'meat' in the book... and not a trace of fat.
