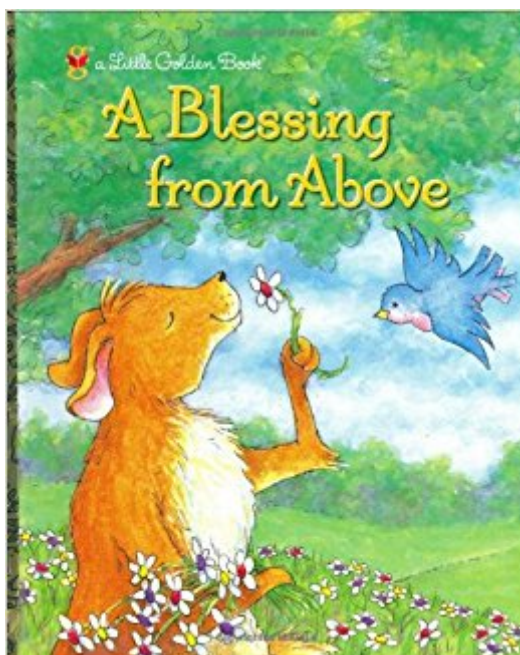

"Once upon a time there lived a mother kangaroo who had an empty pouch," begins this earnest tale of adoption, the first by the author (the mother of two adopted sons) and the artist (an adoptee). As Momma-Roo sits under a tree, imagining what it would be like to show her own little one the sights and sounds of the forest, a baby bluebird tumbles out of a crowded nest and falls into her pouch. The mother bluebird "knew her nest was not big enough for all her chicks," and is glad to let an elated Momma-Roo have the tiniest nestling. Momma-Roo and Little One frolic in the forest, and every night they "thank God for all their blessings... especially for each other." Very young children will probably be satisfied with the simply resolved plot and the delicate prettiness of the watercolor

illustrations, but adoptive parents may wonder if a trans-species adoption is the most appropriate analogy, and adopted children may wish that the perspectives here were not only those of the two mothers. While a general sense of faith suffuses the book, the story concludes with a quote from Ephesians ("In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ"), limiting the audience to Christians. Kindergarten-Grade 2-This sentimental picture book, which begins and ends with New Testament Scripture, is about a mother kangaroo that prays for a baby. Seeing other animals with their young only intensifies her longing. When a baby bird falls out of an overcrowded nest and lands in the kangaroo's pouch, she hugs her "blessing from above" and decides to raise it as her own. There are several problems with this adoption story. Apart from the questionable circumstance of the mother bird being delighted to have a chick for which she has no room adopted, or calling a childless kangaroo "Momma-Roo," Henderson's story has the wrong focus for the intended audience. It is not on the youngster being adopted, but on the mother and her desires. Edge's watercolor and pen-and-ink cartoon illustrations depict a tranquil countryside complete with blooming flowers, ducks on a lake, and a large willow tree-hardly the environment in which to find a kangaroo. Jamie Lee Curtis's *Tell Me Again about the Night I Was Born* (HarperCollins, 1996) is a far more suitable, child-centered choice. Okay, *contains spoilers* :-) Firstly, story was on time, perfect shape book. This is a cute story overall, but can't see sharing it with my girls via adoption bc of one page- bummer, but can't work around it! The baby bird falls accidentally from the overcrowded nest, and the mama bird leaves the one fallen birdie with mama kangaroo bc her nest is too full. The other babies stay with the mama bird. I know this actually can be reflective of some adoption stories, but not for us (so adds more complexity/ worry than necessary at a very early age). I think we can find better ways to talk about why. Somehow the writing right there missed the mark on emphasizing the baby's worth, and came off as a mom might leave one baby if she has "extras"..... I totally get that it's hard to hit the just-right treatment of this moment in a kid's story.....just not for us.

While some critics tear this story down by saying the focus is wrong or that it has a limited audience,

I disagree. This is a sweet story of the longing for a child by a momma to be. An adopted child can see how much he or she was longed for...how very precious they are. That's a winner for any child! The author has done a wonderful job and you will be blessed by the story and illustrations! Thank you Patti and Liz!! Love the story. Especially love that it ends with one little Bible verse at the end. No religious comments in the rest of the book however. A (possibly single - no other kangaroo is mentioned) female Roo with an "empty pouch" adopts a baby when momma bird just can't keep little bird in her nest (she fell out because it was so crowded). Birth momma bird is happy that her little bird has a warm cozy home now (although it doesn't show the birdy in the pouch). It ends with baby bird and her momma Roo giving thanks for each other.

I'm sure I could have taken a large paper cutter and fixed it, but I didn't have one or the time to find one before the shower.

As an adoptive parent we sometimes struggle with ways to introduce our children to adoption but this book has helped make it easier and relatable for a 3 yr. old. Being adopted at 3 months she has no clue about her adoption but this book 'A Blessing from Above' helps put it into perspective in a way

that I could not explain because she's still young. However this book helps her understand in her lil mind that every mother who loves children longs to have a child.

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
